The Power of Girls to Change the World

Girls have a tremendous potential to learn about what is happening outside of their daily lives and to act as a group to make a big difference in the world.

GIRLS GIVING GRANTS is a magically simple way for girls to learn how to become young philanthropists. Here's the answer to teens who ask, "How could I possibly make a difference?"

By combining individual compassion and understanding along with the collective power of acting as a group, you can discover what it's like to significantly change the lives of people who suffer from disease and extreme poverty.

How GIRLS GIVING GRANTS works:

Any girl can make a difference in the lives of people suffering from disease and poverty. Here are the 5 easy steps that show you how:

1. A girl picks a name for her group — for example, "Girls Giving Grants of New Hope, Pennsylvania." She then ask a few of her friends to join the group.
2. The group reviews three worthwhile projects for possible funding. The Face-to-Face AIDS Project provides real stories, photographs, and videos for the group to use in learning about who they might give their grant to, and for helping them get new members to join.
3. Every member of the group contributes \$100. Through social networks such as Facebook and Twitter, and activities such as sports teams and school clubs, the group increases how many members it has.
4. The group invites as many girls as possible to join by December 10, 2010. After a discussion, each member then votes for her favorite project.

5. The donations are sent to Face-to-Face, which takes the grant to its recipient in early 2011. Update reports are provided to the group so that they know that their efforts have improved the lives of many.



The beauty of GIRLS GIVING GRANTS is that by working together, girls can make a significant, meaningful impact with their \$100 contributions. 50 girls would deliver a \$5,000 grant, which would dramatically improve the lives of hundreds of Cambodians and Malawians suffering from HIV/AIDS and poverty.

To encourage girls to participate, individuals could utilize the "Giving Your Gift" concept, where a youth requests one family member to donate \$100 in place of a birthday or holiday gift.

A TEACHER FOR ORPHANS

\$2,500

Your group of 25 members can support a teacher in Cambodia at an innovative school in Phnom Penh or Battambang. These schools give free education to children whose families are too poor to send them to regular school.



HIV & POVERTY-AFFECTED FAMILIES

\$5,000

Your group of 50 members can support 25 HIV+ families in a maize garden program that gives food security and basic healthcare in a Malawi village. This acclaimed program includes youth leadership and outreach efforts to train neighboring rural villages.
